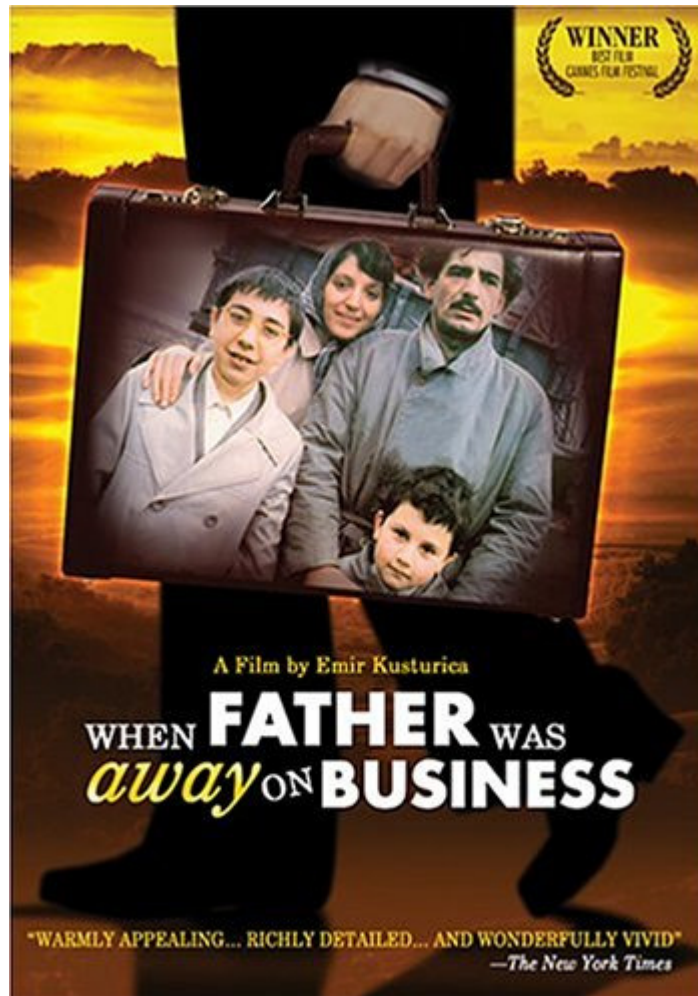


On Sunday 24th October 2010

Set in the early 1950s in post-World War II Yugoslavia during the paranoid years of the Tito reformation, this warm comedy tells the story of a family through the eyes of 6 year-old Malik, whose father Meša has 'gone away on business' (i.e. sent to a labour camp) supposedly after a careless remark about a political newspaper cartoon, in reality also due to his affair with the mistress of his high-ranking party official brother-in-law. Family drama and acutely observed social comedy are expertly blended together into a gentle, touching film alive with humanity and humour, winner of the coveted Palme d'Or award.
