Nine Oaks Vineyard – July Update

With the launch of our second wine, our first wine tastings and open-air theatre in the vineyard, June has been a really busy and exciting month!

Alongside our still Pinot noir rosé we have now also launched a still Chardonnay which is available in Hothfield stores, as well as other select Kent retailers. The arrival of our Chardonnay has also coincided with our launch of both wines at one of Kent's oldest specialist food and wine retailers, Macknade Faversham. During English Wine Week Helen will be in store at Macknade on 23rd June for a producer-led wine tasting and on the 6th July she will be part of the Macknade's Summer Wine Fa





In terms of the vineyard and vines, we have been busy cutting off the sacrificial canes as we are now past the traditional frost period that so often plagues English vineyards. Early June was characterised by rapid cane growth and the emergence of the tiny bunches that will become our crop for this season. In early July we have the most important part of the vineyard season, flowering, whereby the vines selfpollinate, and the bunches open out into individual grapes. Fingers crossed for some nice warm settled weather over this period!

Following our debut open-air theatre events in

June, this August we will welcome Quantum Theatre to the vineyard who will be showing The Tale of Peter Rabbit and Benjamin Bunny, and A Midsummer Night's Dream as open-air theatre on Sunday 20th August. Tickets available at:

HOTHFIELD HEATHLANDS IN JULY



Ground nesting birds and dogs on leads: Thank-you to everyone for supporting the wildlife at Hothfield Heathlands by keeping their dogs on a lead across all the open areas. Hothfield Heathlands Updates June 2023

The Precious Peatland project work will be continuing over the next few months (all the works to be finished by the end of the year). Click on this link for a good summary of the project.

The work is focused on improving peat bogs, of which Hothfield has the best ones in the county. Peat bogs are mainly made of sphagnum mosses that have built up over thousands of years, they store tonnes of carbon making them one of the best natural carbon stores – better than trees! Peat acts like a sponge, holding water to reducing drought in the summer and flood in the winter. They have an amazing diversity of wildlife associated with them, including carnivorous plants, dragonflies,

and reptiles.

Peat bogs are very vulnerable, they can be damaged by invasion of scrub, which sucks out the water, pollution from enriched water, sewage, and farm waste. On a larger scale, many of our peat bogs have been destroyed through extraction for garden peat.

How can you help?

The easiest thing you can do is make sure the compost you buy from a garden centre is 100% peat free. Check the small print, most garden centre compost does not use peat anymore, but a recent visit revealed several which still contained up to 50% peat.





Every year KCC Highways & Transportation receive lots of complaints regarding trees, hedges and other vegetation, which overhang the highway from private property. This can pose a number of problems for people trying to use the footways, especially if they are trying to pass with buggies, wheelchairs and scooters. It would be greatly appreciated if you could ensure that any trees and hedges that are border-

ing the Highway are maintained and cut back to your boundary which would greatly benefit all Highway users. This will help us all keep the highway safe and prevent the need for KCC writing to you requesting that you cut back your vegetation. If the boundary of your property borders the footway, then please be aware that: A) The full width of the footway/ pavement must be available for use by pedestrians. B) There must be a minimum height clearance over the footway/ pavement of 2.1 metres/7 feet for any vegetation. If the boundary of your property borders the carriageway, then please be aware that: A) If you have vegetation that overhangs into the road, there must be a minimum height clearance of 5 metres/16 feet to accommodate buses and HGVs that may use the road. B) If your property is rural, then vegetation should be 0.45 metres/1.5 feet behind the edge of the road and all signs need to be kept clear of foliage.
