## **HOTHFIELD HEATHLANDS IN NOVEMBER**



### Volunteering at Hothfield Heathlands



This year Kent Wildlife Trust has been celebrating sixty-five years of work. Hoth-field Common as it was then known, became a Local Nature Reserve in 1961 having been purchased by West Ashford Rural District Council in 1959. Hothfield Common is now part of a much bigger Hothfield Heathland, one of 90 nature reserves in the county that KWT manage. It is one of Kent's very special reserves

with, as the 1951 citation for its designation as a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI) says, the best (only) example of a valley bog in Kent and associated heathland.

There are currently some thousand KWT volunteers working on reserves county-wide, with one terrific team based in Ashford. The Ashford Green Team is on the look-out for new recruits, of all ages and all backgrounds, always on the understanding that volunteers do just what they can in the time they can offer. They are

made very welcome and the range of skills and knowledge brought to the team is hugely appreciated, the sum of the efforts is much greater than the individual contributions.

Training, supervision, tools, protective clothing where necessary, and first aid expertise, along with hard work, camaraderie, baked potatoes in the bonfire,

getting wet, or cold or very hot, and, always, making a difference, is all part of the package. The team works throughout the year and covers Hothfield, The Warren, Hoads Wood, Conningbrook Lakes, Stone Wood, with the chance to work on or visit reserves further afield and take training courses. Volunteers are kept up to date with schedules via a whatsapp group, emails and a members facebook page.

The work includes extracting young trees, repairing fences, building dead hedges, scything, brash cutting, fixing paths, looking after the livestock, making small dams and much more.

Some of the reasons given by current and past volunteers, including me the desk-bound volunteer, for our involvement are:

- making a difference for wildlife
- continual learning about wildlife and conservation practice
- physical and mental benefits, a healing connection with nature,
- you can just be yourself
- weekly challenges and the good company
- being part of something larger
- learning new skills
- feeling alive
- a springboard to other possibilities

## HOTHFIELD HISTORY SOCIETY

## Free talk: "Ashford's Worst Day: the 'Great Raid' of 24th March 1943",

Everyone is welcome to our free talk at 7pm in the Village Hall on 30th November to hear about the bombing raid on Ashford that happened in daylight on the morning of 24 March 1943.

Ed Adams, author of the recently-published 'Ashford at War', will present a detailed account of three minutes of horror, illustrated with rare and unseen photographs.

The fifteen bombers flying at up to 350mph originally targeted the railway works at Newtown but some then went on to shoot cannon and machine guns at the town as well as randomly dropping bombs on the town.

The Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers were based at Repton Manor and also suffered from these bombers. Their base has since been redeveloped and is now the back garden of no.2 Barley Mow View and behind Repton Manor Primary School.

Ed's talk will compare views of the locations as they



were then and now. Stores and bunk-rooms were hit, as well as the Nissen huts used as dining halls for the soldiers (male) and ATS (female).

A mobile dentists' van parked by the men's dining hall received two cannon shells, and around ten oil drums, camouflaged by netting, were also ripped open by shells. The contents flowed out but luckily did not ignite. An ATS orderly on duty in the men's dining hall was struck in the thigh and knee by fragments of a cannon shell that exploded on the concrete floor. Outside, three civilian contractors could only find a hedge under which to take cover from the attack. They were hit by machine-gun bullets: one in the chest and leg; one in the back, left arm and left thumb; the third in the left calf. All four casualties were taken to Hothfield Hospital for treatment and recovered from their injuries.

Ed Adams is a freelance author and historian, and the owner of Tenterden-based Canterley Publishing Ltd, a company specialising in local-interest and heritage books. He has written extensively on aspects of Kent's history, including the Home Front of the Second World War, individual histories of various schools, and past-and-present photographic commentaries. Copies of 'Ashford at War' will be available to buy.


